NRECA Youth Tour to Washington D.C. is back!



STAY TOASTY AND WARM WHILE **TURNING DOWN** 68 THE THERMOSTAT

When the winter winds blow, it is tempting to adjust the thermostat up a few degrees to stay toasty and warm. However, turning to other (FREE!) ways to help keep you warm could help reduce your energy bills.



Each degree you reduce your thermostat saves 1% on your heating bill. No one home during the day? Adjust your thermostat 7 to 10 degrees from its normal setting to save up to

Capital Credits to be distributed on power bill in December

In an effort to reduce the cost of distributing Capital Credit retirements we are making some changes to our process. Beginning in 2021, all active members eligible to receive patronage retirements will be receiving the funds in the form of a credit on their power bill. Members with capital credit payouts exceeding \$600 or who no longer have active accounts will receive patronage in the form of a check.
